If you are interested in coming on any of the trips we will be taking or joining in on the activities we've planned, please sign up in the Activity Book next to the front desk. The more the merrier!!





Meet your Neighbor, Alice Williams

Alice was born in Tacoma, Washington, the fourth of five children. Her English father and Finnish mother had moved from the East Coast to the "hamlet" of Rocklyn, WA, where Alice's father worked in the coal mines and logging.

Shortly after Alice turned six, her parents divorced. Her mother, Helen, with five children in tow, moved to the small community of Hobart, WA. She purchased 10 acres, with plenty of space for cows, pigs, rabbits and other farm animals. However, to make a living. Helen took the bus to Seattle during the work week, returning home on the weekends. The siblings took care of each other, while their neighbors kept a close watch. Eight years later, Helen had saved enough to buy a home in Seattle. Moving from small town living to the big city changed their lives drastically! Alice enjoyed spending time at Lake Washington Beach with a lively boardwalk, beautiful vistas of the Cascades and the Olympic mountains, and a very handsome lifeguard, who soon became her first bovfriend.

After graduating from High School, Alice decided to attend a 3-year nursing program at Tacoma General Hospital Nursing School. Part of her training was in Vancouver, British Columbia at the Children's Hospital pediatric ward. Alice was awarded a full scholarship to complete her education. Once that task was accomplished, Alice began her nursing career at Seattle's Swedish Hospital in Obstetrics. It was there that she met her husband. Charles, an Obstetrician and **OBGYN.** He had a thriving practice and Alice continued working at the hospital. Their daughter Tracy was born in 1960 and soon after her birth. Alice and Charles decided to move to **Eugene. Oregon. Charles** was looking for a simpler life and hoped to find it with the purchase of a 70-acre farm on Lorane Hwy. The farm included a house, barn and greenhouses. They purchased cattle, horses. and other livestock. Alice had a very special horse. that after training became a jumper and went on to compete. Fortunately, Alice knew about farming from her childhood years. She oversaw the farm and Charles started to practice in Eugene. Their second child. Steven, was born in 1967. Life on the farm went considerably well for 20 vears.

Alice staved on the farm after she and Charles divorced. Her daughter, Tracy, had a beautiful wedding there before the farm was sold and Alice moved to Eugene from Lorane. Alice purchased a cozy house by the fairgrounds and continued her nursing career at McKenzie Willamette Hospital in Springfield. Giving up the farm allowed Alice the freedom to travel. Her son was a great traveling partner. They traveled

around the United States touring the East Coast, the South, the Rust Belt and California. On their trips to Italy and England, Alice and Steven visited many museums and cathedrals, taking in as much art history as possible. A trip to Mexico for five weeks with Tracy and her husband was an adventure as well.

Retiring from McKenzie Willamette Hospital. Alice moved to Bend for a year with the plan of renovating a house she owned there. She enjoyed the beauty of the High Desert and in the winter loved to ski, even going to Canada to helicopter ski! When the Bend project was completed, Alice returned to Eugene and her cozy house by the fairgrounds. Thus began another renovation of both the house and vard. When she needed a break from the work, Alice loved to play tennis.

Alice's daughter,
Tracy, and her husband live
on a 10-acre sheep farm
on the outskirts of Eugene.
Her son Steven lives in San
Francisco with his husband
and teaches Art History
at the Academy of Art
University.

When Covid took over in 2020, Alice disliked being alone and being forced to stay home. To make matters worse, she fell on an icv sidewalk. breaking her pelvis and injuring her elbow. The long, painful recovery included several surgeries on her elbow and weeks of rehab. Upon returning home, Alice decided to move to the Eugene Hotel, where she enjoys the company and companionship of the residents. Welcome Alice!
