We'll feature work by Ira Gershwin, E. Y. "Yip" Harburg, Johnny Mercer, Dorothy Fields, Andy Razaf, B. G. DeSylva and more...along with lyricists who were also composers such as Irving Berlin, Frank Loesser, and Cole Porter, while including work by composers such as Richard Rogers, who primarily worked with the two famous lyricists Lorenz Hart and Oscar Hammerstein II, each partnership bringing different styles of music to Broadway.

With OFAM 2024 Summer, Chuck Redd and company explore the work of these great lyricists and their partnerships with the composers we know and love throughout the years.


Antique Faire and Classic Car Show in Brownsville Saturday, August 3 at 10:00 a.m. -Meet in the Lobby





Come to the Billiard Room for a friendly game of Mahjong. Don't forget your coin purse and a 2024 National Mahjong Card.
