Judy Kilgore

I was born Oct. 21, 1939 in Everett, Washington and given the name Judith Lynne Zennan. We soon moved back to Menlo Park, 25miles south of San Francisco to be near my mother's mother, who ran a board & rooming house. We lived nearby until change in the form of WWII brought black out blinds and rations of gas and

Early in 1943, my Dad enlisted and was sent to England for 3 years. My mother became seriously ill and we moved to the boarding house. In December of '43 my mother passed away and I continued to live with my Gramma at the boarding house.

Early in 1944, the military built a rehab hospital near our home. The Red Cross commandeered the boarding house, filling it with as many service men's wives as they could. Soon our home was filled with service men in all kinds of repair; from bone or skin grafts, to blindness. One blind visitor specifically would only let little Judy lead him to a chair. The old piano was constantly being played.

Gramma baked cakes for patients. The garbage truck drivers worked a deal with the mess hall for help. They set egg crates aside with a layer or two of eggs along with sugar and lard containers not fully empty. The drivers left them at the boarding house to be returned to the base in the form of cakes.

In early '46 came more changes. My Dad returned along with his British War Bride. Their plan was to move to Seattle, where they would stay with family to start. It was then he asked Gramma to keep me another year; She replied, "No! Either take her now or let me adopt her." So he signed, they left, and I became Judith Lynne Huesties.

The hospital closed, wives left with their husbands and boarders returned.

The owner of the 1905 house wanted the property in order to enlarge his lumberyard next door. He approached Gramma with the offer for the house if she could have it moved. She found a piece of property a block and a half away. So one morning the house, with everything in it, including 5 fireplaces, was lifted up, set on large log rollers and was moved to the new property all in one day. A few weeks later we moved back in.

Being an only child in a house full of men meant spending lots of time in my room. My dolls all had names and were like friends. We along with my teddy bear even held our own "election" for Tru mar??

The radio was a companion with programs like "The Green Hornet" and "The Shaddow Knows" ending with me standing at attention when the station went off air for the night and played the National Anthem. This was my beginning life-long love of dolls and paper dolls. To this day I still have my 85 year old teddy bear and 4 childhood dolls.

1950 brought yet another change; Gramma had asthma which forced her to sell the boarding house. We moved to Oregon to live with her sister and brother-in-law on Rattlesnake Road near Dexter. Coming from a small city near San Francisco, very modern to a farm...Quite a culture shock. Gramma spent several days in

Sacred Heart filled with iron lungs, trying to breath; Until her doctor suggested a new drug, Cortisone. She had to sign a release for the medication. Once she had signed and received the medicine, she was soon back with me and breathing easier, as well as giving herself shots. The next July, Gramma bought a home about a half mile away. I continued attending Pleasant Hill School, Graduating in 1957. On to graduate in '58 from Eugene Beauty College. In October of 1958 I married Lloyd Kilgore, he was a '56 graduate of Willamette High. He was in the Army. After time in Kentucky and Oklahoma three years later we came home with 6 month old son Kevin to live with Gramma. Daughter Corine (Cori) was born in '62 and daughter Linda in '63. Kevin graduated from high school in '79 and Cori and Linda together in 1980. Our beloved Gramma passed away in January of 1980. That year on May 18, her birthday, Mt. St. Helen's blew her top. We all said, "We all know you're watching us, we'll be good!" After high school, all three attended college and on to their futures. Lloyd and I moved to Corvallis in '86 where he worked in admissions for OSU and I worked at Fred Meyer. We returned to Eugene in 2019 to be near Cori, because Lloyd's parkinson's was getting worse.

In December of 2022 he passed away. Our family had grown to 11 grand kids and 14 great grand kids.

I moved to the Eugene Hotel in October of 2023. I have enjoyed my first two years here, getting to know neighbors and table mates, I look forward to many more.


