Those are the strong suit of cards she held in her hand. Even though Chicago-born, she chose to live decades in New York City. In the 1980s she saw the top floor of the Trump Tower being lit up by a single bulb to give the appearance of someone actually paying the outlandish price to live there. 
different tune as she tries valiantly to outwit the woman who won the four heart bid.





